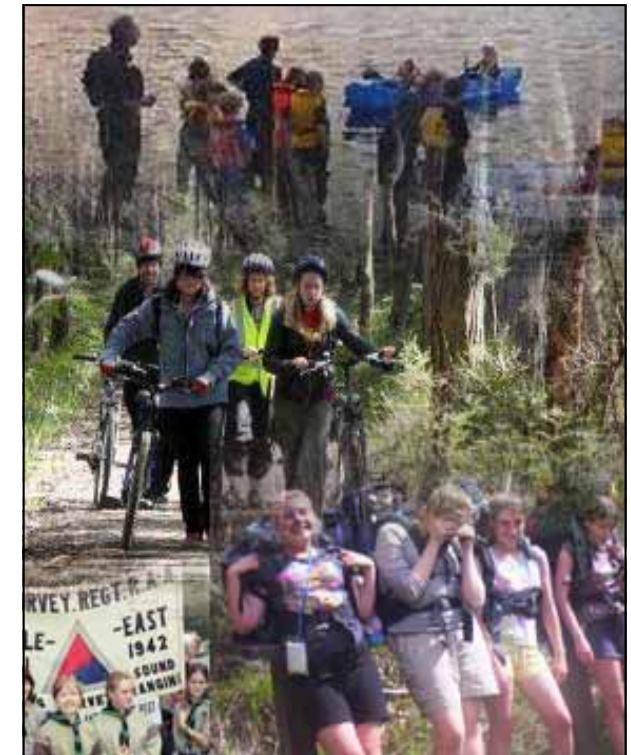

Cubs

Cub Scouts, for girls and boys have lots of fun and adventure. Scouts

There are badges to earn to further develop skills learned in cubs or by developing new skills.

Venturers

Some of the activities undertaken by the Venturers are Adventure Activities, Personal Growth and Leadership Development activities, career preparation and Community Involvement. In Venturer Scouts, you can do all this and more, depending on your interests. It's the Youth Members not the adults, who plan and run the activities. Each Venturer Scout Unit is managed by its own Unit Council. The Adult Leader is part of the council and is there to offer guidance and support.

Rovers

Rovers offer an opportunity for fun, adventure and service to the Scout Association and the wider community. The Crew has a very varied program from week to week.

A typical month might include things like going to the movies, going away for the weekend, playing volleyball against another Crew, or going out to see a band. Every month we have a formal business meeting to make decisions and plan the next few month's activities.

Leaders

Many of our parents become Leaders. This is a challenging but very rewarding role. The Scout Association provide you with all the necessary training. You get the opportunity to learn new skills, such as those involved in adventure activities and first aid and to take them to a high level if you choose.
